

For more than a year, the union-represented workers at ASARCO/Grupo Mexico's Mission, Silverbell, and Ray mines, Hayden smelter, and Amarillo, TX, refinery, have been struggling to negotiate a new contract.

Despite profitability, ASARCO/Grupo Mexico insists on making sweeping changes to contract language and benefits.

In 2013, Grupo Mexico reported consolidated net income of \$1.7 billion for the year.

Grupo Mexico's American Mining Corporation (which holds ASARCO) reported net income of \$1.5 billion for the same time period.

Despite these profits, ASARCO/Grupo Mexico wants to:

• Divide the workforce by providing lesser benefits to new employees.
