Our democracy depends on ordinary people to volunteer to work the polls on Election Day. However, a significant majority of poll workers are over age 60 and at higher risk of complications from COVID-19. They're less likely to work this year. This contributed to unprecedented shortages in the primaries. For instance, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, an expected 180 voting sites for the presidential primary were consolidated into five. The city [typically requires \(usw.to/3e7\)](https://usw.to/3e7) at least 1,400 election workers, but had less than 400 as Election Day approached. [The result was long wait times for voters\(usw.to/3e8\).](https://usw.to/3e8)

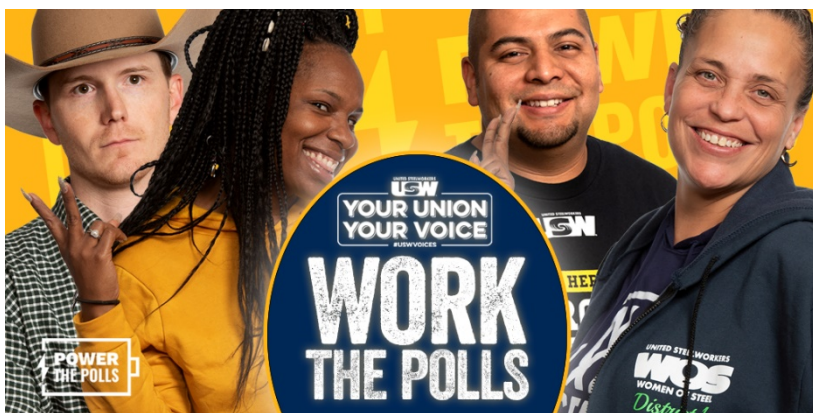

What Does a Poll Worker Do?

Poll workers are recruited and hired locally and help with tasks such as verifying voters' identities, answering questions, and assisting voters who require it. Most of these roles are temporary and paid, requiring a short training period commitment and attendance on the day of the election.
