## Almost all memes are graphics, but not all graphics are memes.

- Both graphics and memes can contain images and text.
- Both are typically used to illustrate a point or idea, and most importantly, to tell a story.
- Memes are traditionally (but not always) humorous or snarky in nature.

## Why are graphics important?


 People remember 10% of information three days later after hearing it. When paired with a relevant image, people remember 65% of that information three days later. (Anna Mazereeuw, lifelearn.com)

 Content with relevant images get 94% more views than content without relevant images. That's nearly twice as many clicks! (Jeff Bullas, Marketer)




## Kermit The Frog "But That's None of My Business"


 This image was taken from Lipton's "Be More Tea" campaign which featured several Muppets as a promotional tie-in with the movie Muppets Most Wanted.

 This particular image included snarky text about faux-pas or questionable behavior, followed with the phrase "but that's none of my business."









#### The "Crying Jordan" Meme


